Taylor said the group was comprised of a good mix of young and older people.

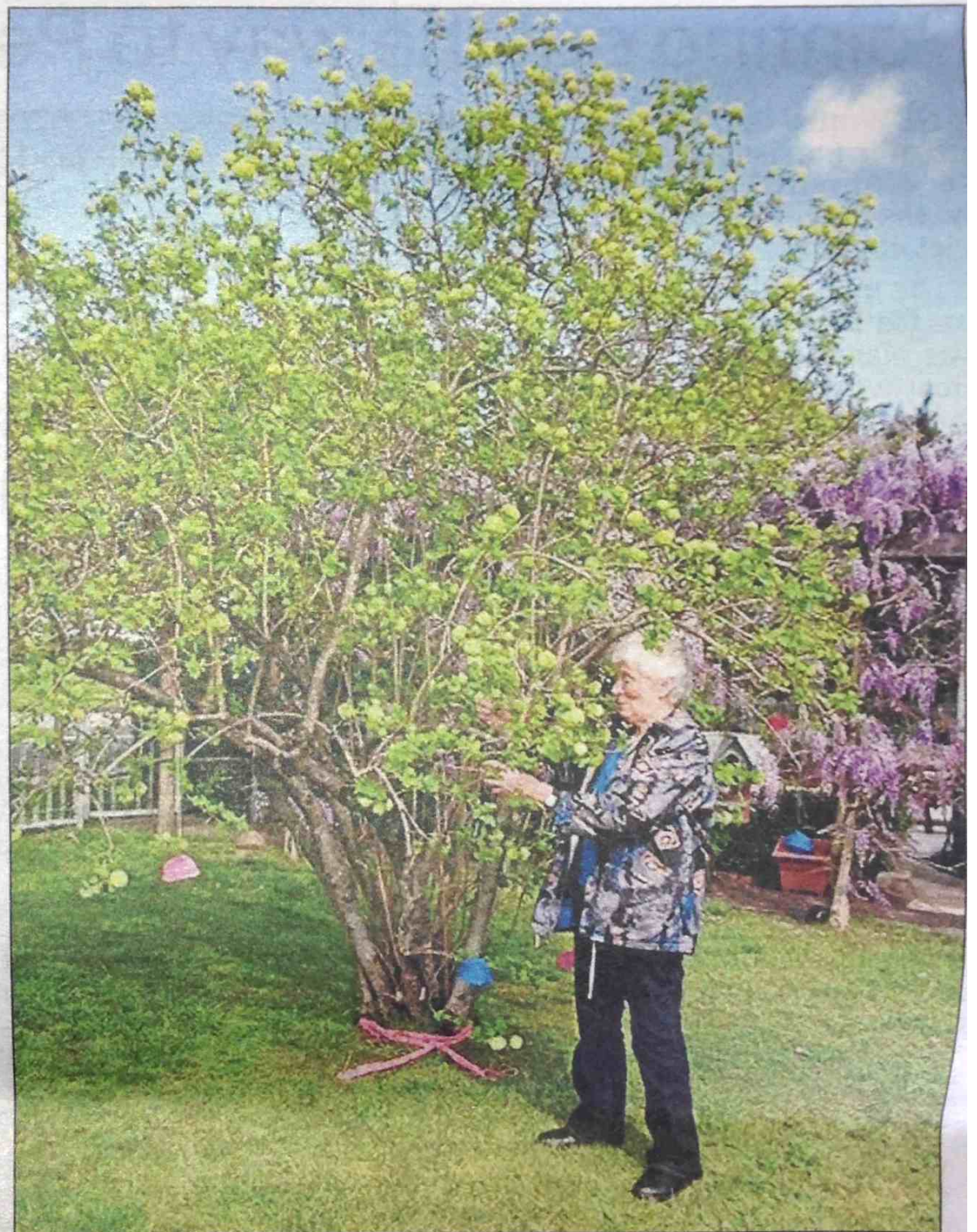
“It’s been a lot of fun,” she said.
